The success of the PA Route 6 Heritage Corridor hinges on the teamwork of two nonprofits, the PA Route 6 Alliance and Pennsylvania Route 6 Tourist Association, which work together to: preserve, enhance and promote the transportation heritage of one of the nation's first transcontinental highways, sustain and enhance the small rural communities linked by the highway, and preserve and enhance the natural, scenic beauty of one of America's favorite road trips.

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EDUCATION & INTERPRETATION (CONT.)

HERITAGE COMMUNITIES PROGRAM

Community Heart & Soul Grant Awards: With support from DCED, DCNR, and Orton Foundation, the Alliance and Pennsylvania Humanities Council awarded \$600k in funding, training, and support to facilitate the Community Heart & Soul process in 4 communities across the Corridor: Carbondale, Youngsville, Tidioute, and Wyoming County. Received \$50,000 from DCNR Special Grant Round 28.6 to fund up to 2 new communities for the PA Heart & Soul Program.



Phases of the Program

- Phase One: build awareness, interest, and commitment in all segments of the community.
- Phase Two: story gathering leads to development of Heart & Soul Statements that identify what matters most and reflect what they love about their towns.
- Phase Three: develop action plans to guide future town planning based on their Heart & Soul Statements.
- Phase Four: Heart & Soul Statements adopted by town and city councils and are used to guide future policies and decisions.

OPEN SPACE & RECREATION

BICYCLE TOURISM

PA Route 6 is designated as BicyclePA Route Y and U.S. Bike Route 36 (USBR 36), PA Route, bike tourism has been a focus for the Alliance. We have created 6 Signature Loops as well as bicycle loops in each of our 20 Heritage Communities to showcase some of the best riding across PA Route 6. Attended the Philly Bike Expo in 2021 and 2022 to promote these riding opportunities to cyclists. Worked with Amy Camp of Cycle Forward to develop a Plan for Bike Tourism Along PA Route 6. Partnering with Planning Commissions in the 4-county region of the PA Wilds to design and install bike racks and repair stations after receiving funding through DCNR Special Grant Round 28.6.





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ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

PA ROUTE 6 FAÇADE PROGRAMS

Our goal is to complete façade improvement projects in all 11 counties across the PA Route 6 Corridor. Following the success of the program in the PA Wilds, Endless Mountains Region, and Great Lakes Region, the Alliance partnered with the Lackawanna Heritage Valley National and State Heritage Area to bring the facade program to Lackawanna County. In 2023, we are bringing the program to the Pocono Mountains, which will achieve our goal of completing facade improvement projects in all 11 counties across the PA Route 6 Corridor.

The Facade Program is made possible through project funding through the PA Department of Community and Economic Development (DCED) with support from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (DCNR) and local business match.





Façade Program funds stay local, through local contractors, construction companies, hardware stores, sign designers, etc., who also employ local residents, resulting in a cyclical effect of exponential economic benefit for the community far exceeding the amount of the initial grant.
